

MASTER/JOURNEYMAN NEED TO PROVIDE SUPERVISION WHEN DOING ELECTRICAL WORK

Master electricians or the Journeyman they employ are required to provide direct and constant supervision of apprentice electricians, including Class B electricians working for a Master in a North Dakota electrical firm as stated in North Dakota Administrative Rules 24-02-01-02(2). **The Class B electrician would also need to be registered as an apprentice electrician**. It is also the responsibility of the electrical contractor at all times to check and make sure that all new and current employees are properly registered or licensed with the State of North Dakota. Every couple of months, an inspector does discover that this has not been done. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

REPORTING OF PROBLEMS WITH ELECTRICAL PRODUCTS

If electricians are witnessing problems with electrical products and equipment, they need to report this to the North Dakota State Electrical Board with the manufacturer's name, model/serial numbers, and the problem they are witnessing. The N.D. State Electrical Board has developed a form entitled "Information Needed When Arc Fault Interruptors Trip" and has also been working with electrical manufacturers and testing laboratories to resolve the problems. If you have any questions or comments, please feel free to contact your local inspector or the North Dakota State Electrical Board's office. We would like to thank the companies and individuals that have already informed this office and completed the forms. We ask you to continue sending the forms into this office. Once we receive the forms, we have allowed other type of breakers to be used on an individual case only. WASHINGTON DROPS OUT OF RECIPROCAL LICENSE AND CEU AGREEMENT

The State of Washington has notified that they will no longer accept reciprocal licenses with the State of North Dakota as of March 31, 2009. Washington's reason for not participating in the reciprocal agreement was that the new applicant can take the exam on a weekly basis.

We were also informed of Washington's procedures to accept continuing education credits due to their unique requirements for specific types of continuing education. A class provider, from outside of Washington, must now get the class and instructor approved in Washington.

MORE INSPECTIONS ON START-UP COPIES OF WIRING CERTIFICATES ARE BEING DONE

The North Dakota State Electrical Board has seen the effects of hiring additional inspectors in the past few years. The goals of providing more periodic and timely inspections have benefited both the consumer and the electrical contractor. Inspectors are available to inspect one or two-day small jobs off the start-up copy of the certificate. Our goal is to provide better customer service.

CHECK FOR LISTING OF EQUIPMENT

We are still witnessing where equipment is being installed that are not listed or evaluated by an engineer as required in NEC Article 90.7 and 110.3(b) and North Dakota Administrative Rules 24-02-01-03. Also important is when you are using disconnects and panels as service equipment, you need to comply with 230.66 and look for markings suitable for use with service equipment.

WATER-DAMAGED ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

Due to the recent flooding, fifty-one of 52 counties of the State of North Dakota were declared flood disaster areas, in which some had experienced water-damaged electrical equipment. The North Dakota State Electrical Board issued three public service announcements informing owners that if their electrical wiring or equipment (breaker panel or fuse box) has been submerged in water that they should call the power supplier to turn off power immediately. Flood-damaged electrical equipment is a serious hazard and recommendations could be found in "Guidelines for Handling Water Damaged Electrical Equipment" published by the National Electrical Manufacturers Association (NEMA). We would like to thank the public, electrical contractors, power suppliers, Emergency Management and the staff of the North Dakota State Electrical Board for their coordinated efforts. When a disaster happens, it may be instinctive to return to normal life as soon as possible. With everyone involved going above and beyond their regular duties, citizens of North Dakota were able to quickly and safely return to their homes as soon as possible with the assurance their electrical system and equipment were safe to be energized.
