NORTH DAKOTA STATE ELECTRICAL BOARD HIRING ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR

The North Dakota State Electrical Board has an opening for an electrical inspector. Minimum qualifications are: A high school graduate with electrical trade school degree preferred. Have qualifications of a licensed North Dakota Journeyman and the ability to obtain a North Dakota Master license within 90 days of employment. Have a firm knowledge of the National Electrical Code and North Dakota Laws, Rules and Wiring Standards. Ability to be a problem solver with excellent interpersonal, written and oral skills. Ability to learn computer system, read and trace circuitry, schematics and blueprints. Must be a self-starter committed to time management, highly motivated, teamwork, high quality customer service and be able to multitask projects. Flexible scheduling and overnight travel required. Must be able to lift 50 pounds, climb ladders and scaffolds and follow department's safety procedures. Must possess a valid driver's license. Must successfully complete standard background and criminal record check. This position will be required to reside in the Grand Forks area (District 5) and cover Cavalier, Pembina, Ramsey, Walsh, Nelson, Grand Forks and portions of Steele and Traill counties. A State Fleet vehicle will be provided for work purposes.

Applicants must complete an <u>Application for Employment State Form 10950</u> (available at web site <u>http://www.nd.gov/hrms</u>, any N.D. Job Service, or at the North Dakota State Electrical Board by calling (701) 328-9522). Applicants must also submit with the Application a resume and cover letter explaining how their education, experience, and skills will qualify them for this position. Applicants who are residents of North Dakota and eligible to claim veteran's preference must include Form DD214. Claims for disabled veterans' preference must include a current statement of disabled status from the Veteran's Affairs Office. Completed Applications must be received by the N.D. Job Service, 1601 E. Century Avenue, Bismarck, ND 58503 by 5:00 pm on <u>September 28, 2010</u>.

2011 CODE BOOKS SOON ARRIVING

The North Dakota State Electrical Board will have the 2011 National Electrical Code books for sale to North Dakota licensed electricians for \$55.00. State Inspectors will have them for sale in November, 2010. If you wish to purchase them by mail, you need to contact the State office at (701) 328-9522. There is a \$5.00 shipping and handling charge in addition to the \$55.00 cost. The 2011 NEC books will also be available at our upcoming state-sponsored continuing education classes in January/February, 2011. North Dakota adopts the 2011 NEC on April 1, 2011.

TIME TO START RELATED TRAINING CLASSES

September is the time when school starts throughout the state. The Dakota Area Wide Joint Apprenticeship Training Committee (JATC) and the Independent Electrical Contractors (IEC) classes have started. Apprentices that take related training classes by correspondence through the North Dakota State College of Science (NDSCS) should also start dedicating one night a week for related training. In the 2007 legislature, the requirement for 576 hours of related training to become a Journeyman electrician became law.

We are still aware of apprentices that have been in the trade for over a year and still have not started any related training classes. We encourage you to become a better electrician by studying the necessary materials to pursue a successful career. One will find that the time spent on related training will be very valuable in your life-long career.

ELECTRICIANS NEEDED IN WESTERN NORTH DAKOTA

This office is continuing to experience a large number of applications for electrical licenses from out-of-state individuals to work in North Dakota. We have also received calls from consumers in the western part of the state that need electrical work done and have contacted numerous electrical contractors with no commitment to do the work.

In visiting with electrical contractors in western North Dakota, they have indicated that housing is the main deterrent of hiring electricians. The North Dakota State Electrical Board has seen the same result in having electrical inspectors work this area. If electricians are looking for work and have some means of obtaining housing, you may want to check with the North Dakota Job Service or contractors in that area.

INSPECTORS ARE FINDING SEALING FITTINGS NOT POURED

Inspectors are finding sealing fittings not poured even after the electrical system has been in operation for several months. Conduit and cable seals are required in classified locations and serve two primary purposes to contain explosions to explosion proof enclosures and to prevent the exploding gases from flames migrating into the conduit system during such events. These seals are intended to prevent the passage of flames from one portion of electrical installation to another. These seals are also required to minimize the passage or communication of gases or vapors from a Class 1 location to one that is unclassified. These requirements are found in 501.15. Monitoring of quality control of pouring sealing fittings needs to be checked. Please find time to review your company's procedures on when to pour sealing fittings and make adjustments if necessary. Pouring of Seal Fittings in Cold Weather was covered in the January, 2010 Newsletter.

Each sealing fitting manufacturer has compounds that are capable of being poured without heating the sealing fitting above freezing temperatures. Time can be saved on projects if sealing fittings are poured prior to freeze up.

Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

CEASE & DESIST DISCIPLINARY ACTION

Stephen Hill of Bismarck, North Dakota was charged with two (2) counts of Performing Electrical Services Without a License, which are Class B misdemeanors in violation of N.D.C.C. 43-09-09. On August 12, 2010, Mr. Hill appeared at the Morton County District Court and entered a plea of guilty on each count. Mr. Hill was ordered to pay fees totaling \$250.00. He also received 30 days in jail with 25 days suspended for two years and one year unsupervised probation on each count. Richard Wolfe, District 8 Electrical Inspector, filed the charges.

A thank you goes out to the licensees that have reported electrical work being done by unlicensed individuals. With nine state inspectors and five city inspectors, your notifying us of these incidents will help the inspectors assure that licensed electricians are doing the work.
